Governor's Council on Economic Expansion Presents Report

The Governor's Council on Economic Expansion presented its Phase One report to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor this week. As Metro Cities has reported, the Council was established to recommend policies and strategies for the public, private, and nonprofit sectors that support shared economic prosperity. The Council also makes funding recommendations for a range of programs funded through the state's share of federal ARPA dollars. The <u>final report is available here</u>. The Governor is expected to consider these recommendations for the 2022 legislative session.

Redevelopment Grant and Demolition Loan Program Announces Next \$2 Million Funding Round

DEED will make \$2 million available for the February 2022 funding round of the Redevelopment Grant and Demolition Loan Program. Metro Cities provided key advocacy for this funding in the 2021 legislative session. Funds assist with the cost of demolition and abatement and other improvements, such as soil stabilization and site preparation related to infrastructure necessary for redeveloping blighted property. Demolition Loan funds help public entities demolish and abate blighted structures and prepare the site for potential future development.

An upcoming webinar will provide information on application requirements, including eligible applicants and activities, and projects that will compete well for grant or loan funds. See below for details.

EAB Grant Application Now Open

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is accepting applications until **Monday**, **January 24**, **2022** for its Protect Community Forests Grant program. The DNR has \$2.4 million available for projects that manage emerald ash borer (EAB) through community forestry activities on public lands. The maximum award amount is \$150,000 and no matching funds are required. Cities and other local units of government are eligible to apply, with priority being given to entities with professional tree care credentials, projects removing and replacing ash trees, and projects that benefit underserved populations.
